- Provides additional safety for our members and quicker response time
- Rotating schedule with members to keep staffed
 - o Daily driver for member when assigned

Search and Rescue (SAR)

The Need

- Increased population growth and visitors to the Brainerd Lakes Area.
- Aging population, Crow Wing and Cass Counties have older population compared to state average.*
- No official county-wide SAR team exists. (Fire Depts, Police, Sheriff and Drone Team today)
- Crow Wing: 23% of the population, are seniors aged 65 and older. (Census Reporter)
- Cass: 26% of the population, are seniors aged 65 and older. (Census Reporter)
- State of Minnesota: 901,517 individuals aged 65 and older, which constitutes approximately 15.9% of the state's total population. (Census Reporter)
- In 2020, it was estimated that 99,000 Minnesotans aged 65 and older had Alzheimer's disease. This number is projected to increase by 21.2% to 120,000 by 2025. The trend suggests that as the population continues to age, the number of individuals diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease will continue to rise (Minnesota Dept. of Health)

Our Plan

- Continue providing high quality EMS services for our coverage area. (Majority of Rescue Calls have an EMS component)
- Expansion into Search and Rescue for Wildland, Water and Ice Emergencies.
- Partnership with St. Louis County Rescue Squad as our "Big Brother".
- Providing county-wide SAR services for both Crow Wing and Cass counties.
- Added support for Fire, Law, EMS to existing SAR related calls, Lakes Area Rescue will have specialized equipment and training. Will assist these agencies.
- Opportunity to grow membership with SARfocused only members. (FD Members from the area)

The cost of growth

A New Member

- \$7000 medical bag, medications, safety gear/PPE, AED, pager and radio
- \$1,500 \$2000 EMS training
- \$50/year insurance

Approx. = \$9,000/new member

Existing Members (Annual Costs

- \$250 equipment upgrades/replacement
- \$100 cont. EMS training
- \$50/year insurance

Approx. = \$400 per member/year (\$23k/Year)

Search and Rescue Expansion

- Wildland SAR dept. training (\$5k) (Secured!)
- Wildland personal gear (\$10k)
- (2) Response squads (\$50K)
- Thermal drones (\$10-15K) (Secured!)
- UTV (\$25–30K) (1 pending grant Firehouse Subs/1 declined Community Giving)
- Sherp (\$150-200K) (1 pending grant FEMA/1 declined Otto Bremer)
